

SEAE Rules for Abstracts & Papers. Instructions for authors

Abstracts

Abstract must not exceed 250 words have no more than 250 words in word writing size 12 starting with

First line: Title of the paper in capital letters (12)

Second line: Family author's names and first word of the name (10)

Third line: Name of Organisation, address, e-mail, phone & fax number of corresponding author (10)

Key words: 3 to 7 not included in the title.

Full papers size or length of papers

Papers should not exceed 10 printed pages in DINA4, one space and word writing size 12. Text processing preferable will be Microsoft Word.

Index of the paper

The following sections covering the usual contents:

Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgements, References (see below), Tables with figures (see below), Illustrations or graphics (see below), Legends (see below).

Tables

Each table (Table 1) should be typed on a separated sheet, numbered and should be referred to in the text.

Figures

Line drawings (Fig. 1) can either be submitted as original drawings ready to print or as clean and sharp glossy black and white photographs.

Photographs and microphotographs

Photographs should be numbered in sequence with the figures. A scale bar should be drawn where appropriate. Authors should use their own symbols, numbers and lettering to figures, including photographs. The author's name and the number of the figure should be written on the back of each figure.

Legends

Legends of tables and figures conveniently numbered should be typed on a separate sheet and not written on the figures. In papers written in Spanish the legends should be typed also in English.

References

Should be restricted to books, papers, etc., cited in the paper, and should be presented according to the style shown below:

a) Articles from journals

Boyer HW, Roulland-Dussoix D. 1969. A complementary analysis of the restriction and modification of DNA *Escherichia coli*. *Journal of Molecular Biology* 41: 459-465.

Klos J, Kuta E, Przywara L. 2001. Karyology of *Plagiomnium*. I. *Plagiomnium affine* (Schrad.) T. Kop. *Journal of Bryology* 23, 9-16 (Write out the journal names in full)

b) Books, Theses and other sporadic publications

Whelan RJ. 1979. *The ecology of fire*. Cambridge: Cambridge University Press.

c) Articles and chapters from books Huenneke LF. 1991. Ecological implications of genetic variation in plant population. In *Genetics and conservation of rare plants* (Falk DA, Holsinger KE, eds.). Oxford: Oxford University Press, pp. 31-44.

d) Papers in press

Should only be quoted if they have been accepted for publication, their quotation should be as follows:

Werner O, Ros RM, Guerra J. in press. Direct amplification and NaOH extraction: two rapid and simple methods for preparing bryophyte DNA for polymerase chain reaction (PCR). *Journal of Bryology*.

References must be given in alphabetical order of authors (and chronologically for the same author, adding the letters a, b, c, etc. for papers of the same year). In the text, references should be cited in the conventional manner: "according to Packer (1983)", "the energy saving (Margalef 1983)", "in recent papers (Ritley 1998, Rufoss & Canno 1999)", etc. Authors will be mentioned by their surnames (without initials) when they do not exceed two (Kumagai & Hasezawa 2000) and by "et al." when more than two (Sunderesan et al. 1999).

Units

SEAE uses SI units (Système International d'Unités).

Abbreviations

Uncommon abbreviations should be explained.

Proofs

Authors will receive one set of proofs of their paper. Authors should obey the dead lines of the corrected proofs and should avoid introducing extensive modifications of the original text. Correction of proofs should be done according to international symbols and standards, an example of which will be enclosed with the galley-proof. The approximate place to insert figures and tables should be indicated on the corrected proofs.

Final remark

Avoid bold, italic, capital letters, etc. in the paper, only underline scientific names of genus, species, subspecies, etc.
